# WEEK V TOPIC

1. RULE IV. \*SERVING:

# I. IV. \*<u>SERVING</u>:

\*Overhand Serving Rule Trial (OSRT) period was effective from Monday, September 16 through Sunday, September 22. The OSRT did not apply to 8th grade players.

**5th/6th/7th grade player who serve overhand** were allowed to "move-up" to a maximum of **3 feet from the end line.** Basketball courts should be marked with two rectangular blocks [12" wide x 8" deep] located at the base and outside of the court's Free Throw Lane line. The **rectangular blocks are placed 3 feet inside the court from the end line.** (If the court is not marked, visible markers should be placed on both side lines 3 feet from the [outside of] the end line.) Overhand servers are **NOT** allowed to contact any part of the rectangular block before contacting ball for serve. **Violation = foot-fault. Result = side-out/point for opponent.** 

# **CLARIFICATION**

Serving rules will not change for the CAA play-offs or championships.

As published in The Rules for this season, the **OSRT** <u>period was in effect during the first</u> <u>week of competition only. That week was:</u> Monday, September 16 through <u>midnight on</u> <u>Sunday, September 22.</u> As of Monday, September 23, <u>overhand servers</u>, regardless of age/team/league, were not permitted to foot-fault during their turn-at-serve. Overhand <u>servers must stay behind the end line before contacting the ball for serve. Foot-fault</u> violation results in a side-out and one point awarded to opponents.

# **CLARIFICATION**

The serving line, is also called the end line...

... is the continuous line located at the end/back of the playing court. It extends from side line-toside line and serves as the back border of the playing court. It is legal for the server to stand/start serving motion outside of either sideline *before* legally serving the ball. Legal Serve = ball legally contacted behind the serving line and in between side lines before any part of server's foot/feet touches any part of playing court.

NOTE: the court's playing area extends to the outside edges of the serving & side lines.
