## THIS WEEK'S TOPICS The RULES for the PLAY-OFFS & CHAMPIONSHIP SUNDAY MATCH PROTOCOLS & PROCEDURES: REMINDERS and CLARIFICATIONS SERVING

### The RULESPLAY-OFFS & CHAMPIONSHIP SUNDAY

The **RULES** that will govern both *the* week of tournament **PLAY-OFFS** and the finals on *CHAMPIONSHIP SUNDAY* [October 29, Saint Agnes School] are the same/identical **RULES** that have been used for 2023 regular season play. There will be no **RULES** changes for play-off or championship matches.

# RULE I. a.MATCH PROTOCOLS & PROCEDURES:<br/>PRE-MATCH HUDDLING

Each match is scheduled for only 45 minutes. Last-minute instruction/s, dissemination of match strategy/ies, and/or team prayers, *etc.*, <u>should take place during the pre-match warm</u> <u>up period before the PLEDGE is read</u>. The PLEDGE is then read after the conclusion of the warm-up period. Post-PLEDGE reading, match play should commence without delay: each team's six players starting in the/[*any*] set should go directly to their court positions. Other teammates and coaches should go directly to their bench/es; players and assistant coaches must be seated during play. Head coach is permitted to stand [in the coaching zone] during play.

#### RULE II. <u>UNIFORMS</u>:

a. **Jewelry:** players are allowed to wear small, secured stud or post jewelry above the chin. Fiber <u>"friendship" bracelets/anklets are not allowed to be worn</u>. A religious medal/fiber or/and a 'Medic A' bracelet are not considered jewelry. A Medic A bracelet may be visible; religious medal must be taped onto body and worn under uniform. Religious fiber bracelet must be taped over. Rule infractions may result in a team penalty.

Players are prohibited from wearing hoop, charm, bar, cross, *etc.*, earrings and any other jewelry below the chin. Small stud/s *or* post/s jewelry worn discreetly is legal. Large/prominent semi-to-precious stones are not considered small/discreet and not permitted to be worn. The violation is: illegal [uniform/equipment]; offending player may receive a sanction-verbal warning to a Red Card. A **new chart** with visuals to help explain the new **JEWELRY RULES** is now available to view on the CAA website's Volleyball page.

<u>ALSO, NOTE</u>: paint *or* glitter on a player's face/uniform/corps [*e.g.*, school spirit] is **strictly prohibited** [<u>AND</u> potentially injury-causing to players]! **FYI: even a small amount of glitter on a highly polished wooden floor dramatically increases the surface's slippery quality and potentiality for student-athlete injuries** [slips/falls]. A player whose face is painted or decorated with glitter should never be allowed onto court.

# **RULE II.a** MATCH PROTOCOLS & PROCEDURES: (formerly RULE 2.a) who must be seated during match play.

The CAA Volleyball Program does not use the libero position; however, the court has an area called the *\*libero replacement zone*. This zone is *also known as* the **coaching zone**. The **head coach** is *the only person* **permitted to stand/occupy this zone at any time**. Coaches are also permitted to stand/occupy the area behind/beyond the endline; *however*, the sideline extends. **Coach must stay within the court sideline-to-team bench area**. The distinction between the two zones: **coaching zone extends beyond the court's endline**; *libero replacement zone* (*lrz*) **does not extend beyond the endline**.

\*starts behind the ten-feet/3m/'back-row' attack line located on the court. [Note: team bench zones start behind this same line outside the court.] FYI: there are no visual marks/lines/symbols on/off the court that identifies either the **coaching zone** or the *lrz*.

All other assistant coaches and team personnel, *including all players*, must remain seated during play. In between points, one assistant coach may stand to instruct/coach player/players. Once match play resumes, assistant coach must return to their seat.

Team bench members may stand near their bench to greet a player leaving/entering the court and/or in response to an **outstanding play made by their team**. All but the head coach must return straightaway to their seats. Regardless of standing/seated, **cheering**, **taunting**, and/or **verbalizing approval of an opponent's error or mishap is never a spectacular play. Period**. Coaches are responsible for monitoring the behavior of their players and ensuring that the good sportsmanship mentioned in the **PLEDGE** is practiced.

## IV. \*<u>SERVING</u>:

- b. 5<sup>th</sup>/6<sup>th</sup> grades & under are allowed to serve from designated lines/areas
  only when serving underhand. Designated lines/areas must be predetermined by Referee & teams' coaches before match play commences.
- c. 7<sup>th</sup> grade players may take one step into the court from serving line *only* when serving underhand.
- d. 5<sup>th</sup>/6<sup>th</sup>/7<sup>th</sup> grade players may serve up to a maximum of five (5) consecutive legal serves. If player serves the maximum, the player's team retains the serve. The next player in the rotation serves.
- e. Re-Serve is called when server tosses the ball and does not attempt to serve tossed ball. No fault is called if the server: *catches*, *lets drop*, *accidentally kicks* or *mishandles* ball with *or* without touching/catching/kicking, *etc.*, the ball during the attempt. However, **please read the sub-section below.**
- e.1 One re-serve is allowed for each player per their turn-of-service.
