WEEK III TOPIC

1. RULE I. MATCH PROTOCOLS & PROCEDURES-PRE-MATCH TIMING

Teams should arrive at the site 30 minutes prior to their scheduled match time.

TEAMS WILL NOT SWITCH SIDES. Once the home team selects their bench/court, teams will remain on their respective sides for the entire match.

CLARIFICATION PRE-MATCH TIMING

Summary: due to the number of matches scheduled per site per evening, there is limited time in between matches. The Referee sets the warm-up time for teams. Pre-game warm-up activities, including, passing, serving, the PLEDGE, Teams Greeting at Net, prayer/final instructions at bench, should not exceed six (6) minutes. More time may be granted for when time permits.

After the CAA Sportsmanship Pledge is read aloud by one student-athlete from each team, all players [not coaches] should proceed directly to their respective endline. Players should stand anywhere on endline in between the court's sidelines. The referee will then whistle & signal for teams to greet each other by jogging-up right sideline in one line to net, etc. Match play usually would commence here; however, the CAA allows for a brief grace period for prayer/final instructions at their respective benches.

Post-prayers, players **starting in set** should proceed to their court positions per Line-Up form. **Non-starters** and all assistant coaches must be seated in their respective bench areas. The Head Coach may stand during play; **one assistant coach may also stand during a dead/down ball.**

At the match's conclusion, all team members, including those on the bench, should line-up on the endline and await whistle/signal from referee to proceed = jog up to net and offer congratulations to opponent as done earlier during the warm-up period. Coaches, assistant coaches, team managers proceed last.
